The Orangeville Village Board met in the Village Hall on April 3, 2017. Acting President Siedschlag called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Clerk called the roll. Members present: Mike Siedschlag, Don Hoyle, Ray Parriott, Kayla Rodebaugh, Kurt Schilling, Leslie Schmidt, Mike Schindler and Toni Koester. Zero members absent.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Schilling made the motion to approve the agenda. Second by Schilling. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to approve the April 3, 2017 regular meeting agenda carried unanimously.*

APPROVAL OF MARCH 6, 2017 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

Schilling made the motion to approve March 6, 2017 regular meeting minutes. Second by Schmidt. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to approve the March 6, 2017 regular meeting minutes carried unanimously.*

APPROVAL OF MARCH 2017 BILLS

Schilling made the motion to pay \$20,856.98 for March 2017 bills. Second by Parriott. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Hoyle, Parriott, Rodebaugh, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to pay \$20,856.98 for March 2017 bills carried unanimously.*

PUBLIC COMMENT AND COMMUNICATIONS

Resident, Chad Schmidt, requested permission to mow the easement by his house for \$20 per mowing. Also requesting Village to consider clean up of easement from excess blacktop. Schmidt offered to seed area for easier maintenance. Tabled for later discussion.

Website Update - Tingalls

Mobile ap/update going well, Schmidt working with Tingalls on update.

Willet Hoffman 2017 - Street Work: Aaron Fuller

East Street and School Street to Johnson Street designated for 2017 street work, haven't had too much work in last 10 years. Approximately \$40,000 to complete. Motion by Hoyle to adopt Resolution to move forward with repairs for East Street and School Street from MFT funds not to exceed \$42,000. Second by Schilling. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Hoyle, Parriott, Rodebaugh, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to adopt Resolution to move forward with repairs for East Street and School Street from MFT funds not to exceed \$42,000 carried unanimously.*

Wetland Project: Matt Wagner

Wagner presented architectural plans for wetland project to get water moving to help eliminate stagnant/mosquitoes.

NEW BUSINESS

Transfer of Wetlands from Illinois DNR to Village of Orangeville

Transfer of wetlands from Illinois Department of Natural Resources to Village of Orangeville. Sign Quitclaim deed to pay \$1 for wetlands. Hoyle made the motion to spend \$1 for the transfer of wetlands to take control. Second by Schmidt. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Hoyle, Parriott, Rodebaugh, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to spend \$1 for the transfer of wetlands to take control carried unanimously.*

Electric Aggregation Resolution

Resolution to be signed, not locking in, just approval to bid. Motion by Hoyle to accept Electric Aggregation program. Schilling second the motion. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to accept Electric Aggregation program carried unanimously.*

Water and Garbage Bills

Discussion on excessive amount due for outstanding water bills. Procedures in place for collecting overdue bills, need to follow. Outstanding bills need caught up and kept up. Suggestion of certified letters including instruction of payment and ordinance of water payments to be sent to delinquent customers.

Devone Property

Legal council from Thruman on abandoned Devone property. State has statue about abandoned trailers. Thruman to send information for further action.

President Seidschlag and Winslow President Rose met with Cherri Bustos rep to talk about concerns/needs for Villages.

Chad Schmidt Mowing revisited. Decided against paying Schmidt to mow at this time until trustees look at said area.
