The Orangeville Village Board met in the Village Hall on Monday, April 2, 2018. Acting President Siedschlag called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Clerk called the roll. Members present: Mike Siedschlag, Bill Guinther, Don Hoyle, Ray Parriott, Kurt Schilling, Leslie Schmidt, Mike Schindler and Toni Koester. Zero members absent.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Schilling made the motion to approve the agenda. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to approve the April 2, 2018 regular meeting agenda carried unanimously.*

**APPROVAL OF MARCH 5, 2018 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES**

Schmidt made the motion to approve March 5, 2018 regular meeting minutes with revisions. Second by Schilling. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to approve March 5, 2018 regular meeting minutes with revisions carried unanimously.*

**APPROVAL OF MARCH 2018 BILLS**

Schilling made the motion to pay \$15,672.52 for March 2018 bills. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to pay \$15,672.52 for March 2018 bills carried unanimously.*

**AUDIT REPORT: O'CONNOR, BROOKS & CO**

Jon Schubert from O'Connor Brooks & Co presented 2017 audit. Village paying \$40,000 to sewer debt but only collecting \$35,000 from sewer debt collection on water bills. The other \$5,000 being paid from general fund. Schubert

recommended to use general fund to pay off sewer debt and then recoup general fund from the \$35,000. Also to consider restructure payment for Village needs.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

### **Water Bills**

Koester and Schmidt presented possible procedures for customer notification and shut-off letters of delinquent water bills. First, a notice on the back of April's bill to all water bill customers giving notice and plan of action for uncollected/delinquent bills. Second, a letter to be sent to all delinquent customers with unpaid balances past 30 days. Hoyle made the motion to proceed with water payment procedure and to monitor payments. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero members voted nay. *Motion to proceed with water payment procedure and to monitor payments carried unanimously.*

### **Updates on Light Project on Route 26**

ComEd not able to put lights at corner without IDOT permission. Need IDOT to okay and to install.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **Lawn Mowing Contract**

Hoyle presented research on Pieper mowing, cost approximately \$15 per mowing for all Village property currently mowing. Original bid by Chad Schmidt to mow vacant lot at Meadow was \$20 per mowing. Hoyle made a motion for Chad Schmidt to mow for \$15 per mowing, Pieper to mow if Chad is not willing to mow for \$15 per mow. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. Schmidt abstained the vote. *Motion for Chad Schmidt to mow for \$15 per mowing, Pieper to mow if Chad is not willing to mow for \$15 per mow carried.*

### **Business Operation Contract**

Siedschlag made a motion to accept contract for Orangeville Fire, Pieper Lawn Care and Orangeville Schools granting permission to operate UTV's, sidebysides or ATV's within the Village as needed for the coming year. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to accept contract for Orangeville Fire, Pieper Lawn Care and Orangeville Schools granting permission to operate UTV's, sidebysides and ATV's within the Village as needed for the coming year carried unanimously.*

Hoyle made the motion to pay \$120,665 from the general fund to pay off sewer debt if the IEPA allows it. Second by Schilling. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling, Schmidt and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to pay \$120,665 from general fund to pay off sewer debt if the IEPA allows it carried unanimously.*
