The Orangeville Village Board met in the Village Hall on Monday, December 4, 2017. Acting President Siedschlag called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Clerk called the roll. Members present: Mike Siedschlag, Bill Guinther, Don Hoyle, Ray Parriott, Kurt Schilling, Mike Schindler and Toni Koester. Members absent: Leslie Schmidt.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Schilling made the motion to approve the agenda with additions. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to approve the December 4, 2017 regular meeting agenda with additions carried unanimously.*

**APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER 6, 2017 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES**

Schilling made the motion to approve November 6, 2017 regular meeting minutes. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to approve November 6, 2017 regular meeting minutes carried unanimously.*

**APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER 2017 BILLS**

Schilling made the motion to pay \$18,462.02 for November 2017 bills. Second by Parriott. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling, and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to pay \$18,462.02 for November 2017 bills carried unanimously.*

**OLD BUSINESS**

**Wetland Project: Matt Wagner, Wagner Consulting**

Matt Wagner informed that project was still waiting on EPA approval to move forward. Could be up to a year before approved.

### **Sewer Backup Claim: Stateline Insurance**

Tom Marcum present requesting Village for reimbursement from second flood damage caused by sewer backup. Backups were caused by two separate incidents. Pat Widolff, representing Stateline Insurance, to clarify Village insurance. General Liability Policy, no coverage for flood damage from sewer backup, as Village was not at fault. Backup was caused by negligence of the people of the town, not the village. Towels, grease, paper towels, feminine products and grease being dumped into the sewer.

#### **Off Road Vehicle Ordinance**

Dennis Crooks present. Further discussion of off road vehicles. Off road vehicle ordinance (12-81) states they are not permitted in town, no designated area for UTV. Motion by Hoyle to table off road vehicle discussion. Second by Schilling. The Clerk called for a voice vote on the motion. *Motion to table off road vehicle discussion carried unanimously.*

### **Setting the Tax Levy**

Motion by Guinther to accept the tax levy. Second by Parriott. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to accept the tax levy carried unanimously.*

### **Sewer Line Repairs**

Estimates to replace sewer lines on Church St from 304 S Church St to 310 S Church St would be \$35,000. Estimate to purchase jetter for Village, \$12,000. Parriott made motion to purchase jetter for the Village with cost of \$11,998. Second by Schilling. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to purchase jetter for the Village with cost of \$11,998 carried unanimously.*

### **Radio for Squad Car**

Need new radio for squad, no further programming for the current radio. A reconditioned radio, totally reprogrammable cost of \$1500. New radio cost of \$5,000-7,000. Motion by Hoyle to purchase reconditioned radio for squad car at \$1500. Second by Guinther. The Clerk called for a roll call vote on the motion. Members voting yea: Guinther, Hoyle, Parriott, Schilling and Siedschlag. Zero voted nay. *Motion to purchase reconditioned radio for squad car at \$1500 carried unanimously.*
